



The Ganaraska Region Conservation Authority (GRCA) is accepting applications for the following full-time position:

Forest Recreation Technician

The GRCA requires an individual to administer and coordinate the recreational programs in the Ganaraska Forest, which is located north of Port Hope, Ontario. This position is based out of the 11,000-acre Ganaraska Forest and has a 35-hour workweek, Thursday through Monday. This job is very physical in nature.

Responsibilities:

- Operations of recreation programs, including the Forest Membership and winter trails programs
- Coordinating, training and scheduling patrols for Forest Volunteers
- Trail maintenance and site rehabilitation, including winter ski trail grooming
- Liaison with the Ganaraska Forest Recreational Users Committee
- Develop partnerships for further recreation programs and funding
- Assist with special events in the Ganaraska Forest

Qualifications:

- Degree or certificate in Resource Management or related discipline, with a required minimum of 3 years' experience
- Applicants should have excellent communication skills and the ability to work with the public
- The successful applicant must be able to adapt to an environment of change and work well independently, as well as in a team environment
- Experience with using GPS
- Chainsaw operation and safety certification would be an asset
- The successful applicant must have a high degree of initiative
- Applicants must be capable of physically demanding labour and highly aware of safety procedures
- Applicants must be willing to work in all weather conditions
- A current Police Vulnerable Sector Check is required
- A valid Province of Ontario driver's license is required, and GRCA will obtain a 3-year uncertified driver's abstract of the successful candidate upon hiring
